ACTIVITIES

KidzCare Camp, Kerege

In February One World One Smile (OWOS) traveled to Kerege, 40km north of Dar es Salaam, to the KidzCare children's home. KidzCare is a non-profit organization that provides underprivileged children and orphans in Tanzania with housing and education. KidzCare also ensures the overall nutritional and medical wellbeing of their beneficiaries.



OWOS partnered with KidzCare to provide dental treatment to children at the KidzCare run school in Kerege. Not only were children living at the KidzCare home present, but children from the entire village were invited to attend and receive treatment. During the visit the OWOS team performed extractions and provided preventive and restorative treatments as necessary. During the visit 46 children were examined. 23 of these children were found to have oral health issues requiring further attention. These additional treatments were provided onsite during the visit. In addition to providing treatments OWOS volunteers also taught oral hygiene awareness such as proper tooth brushing techniques. The OWOS team is planning to return to Kerege and visit these patients for follow up and further treatments in November 2015.



Dar Smile Music Festival

In March 2015 OWOS launched a fundraising campaign for a Mobile Dental Clinic (MDC) by organizing the first Dar Smile Music Festival (DSMF). The festival was held from 4 to 7 March 2015 in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.



The DSMF 2015 brought a premier classical music experience to Dar es Salaam. The festival consisted of four evenings of performances by a group of professional musicians from The Katarina Gurska School in Madrid, Spain. The Katarina Gurska School is renowned for its musical instruction. The School sent a group of six instrumentalists to Dar es Salaam for DSMF 2015 including: Cecilia Bercovich (viola), Vicente Alberola (clarinet), Bruno Vlahek (piano), Lucia Otero (cello), Georgy Vasilenko (violin), and Sergey Teslya (violin).



The DSMF 2015 performances were each themed around a national or regional style of European music. The four performances included a French themed evening – hosted by master of ceremonies Tanzanian jazz singer Sauda Simba – a Slavic themed evening, a German evening, and the festival concluded with an invitation only

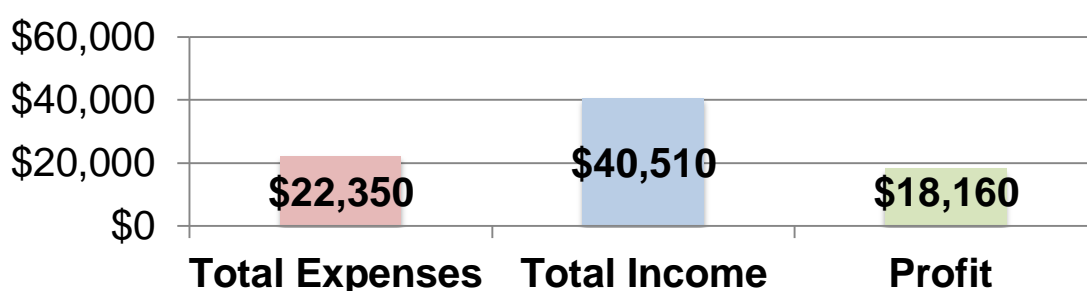
Spanish evening at the Spanish Ambassador's residence.

DSMF 2015 Financial Overview (USD)



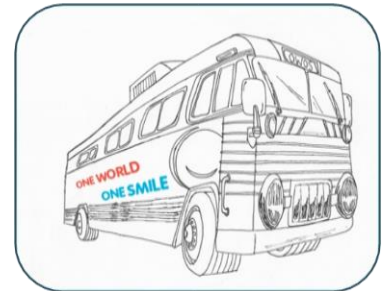

In addition to fundraising via the DSMF OWOS is planning another fundraiser in September 2015 to raise funds for the MDC.

Planning

Mobile Dental Clinic

OWOS is in the process of fundraising and building a Mobile Dental Clinic (MDC). The objective of the MDC is to bring oral health care to communities where it is needed most and to increase the accessibility of dental health services and awareness of dental health across Tanzania.

The MDC will serve multiple populations across broad geographic areas, many of which have no access whatsoever to dental health care. Services provided on board the MDC will include preventative and restorative care including: exams, x-rays, fillings, emergency examination and, eventually, surgeries and palliative care.



The necessity of dental care in Tanzania is particularly heightened due to the prevalence of diseases such as HIV/AIDS and diabetes. Poor oral health is a major risk factor for individuals with such diseases. For example, when an individual is HIV positive the immune system is depleted. A dental infection will drain the remnant reserves of the patient's immune system patients will have a reduced ability to heal wounds and prevent further infection. Such major health concerns occur every day in Tanzania where information on dental care is lacking. The MDC will not only provide care for individuals suffering from deteriorated oral health as the result of other medical conditions, but also will promote oral hygiene awareness and serve to educate individuals and communities on proper hygiene regimes to prevent decay and infection. The impact that oral health can have on overall lifespan should not be underestimated. Thus, increasing oral health awareness and accessibility to treatment is our top priority.

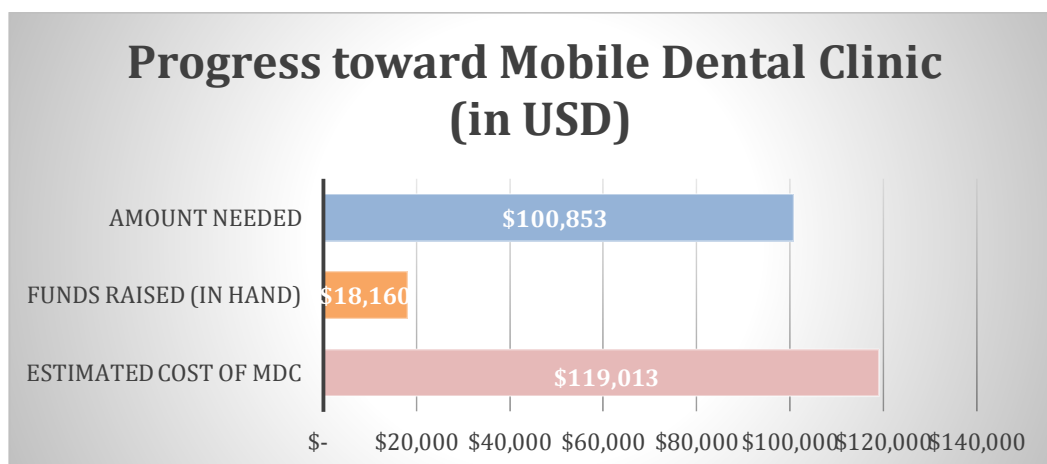
Toward this goal the OWOS team is currently in the process of procuring materials for the body of the MDC as well as the dental equipment for the interior of the vehicle. Below is a table of components that will go into

the MDC. Once these materials are secured construction on the MDC will begin.

Currently, the total estimated cost of the MDC is \$119,031 (USD). This estimate is the compilation of a \$76,151 estimate for vehicle manufacturing and assembly, plus a \$42,862 estimate for dental equipment cost.



Outreach Camp September 2015

Beyond planning for the MDC, OWOS is planning to organize a dental camp in Dar es Salaam at Coco Beach on September 2015, it will be the first time for the team to organize a camp in Dar es Salaam City. OWOS will provide dental services to the community around Msasani area. Oral health awareness will also be taught by OWOS volunteers.
